2021 Music Scholarship

Eligibility criteria:

- For prospective students entering Years 6, 7 and 8 in 2021, who are not currently enrolled at Seymour College.
- Scholarships to be awarded on the basis of the results of a written examination administered by Academic Assessment Services and an interview with the Principal.
- **Please note:** all Music Scholarship applicants must first apply for the Academic Scholarship.
- The Scholarship Academic Assessment Services examination will be held on Saturday 15 February 2020.
- The tuition remission and duration will be at the discretion of the Principal.

Selection criteria:

- Applicants must be a minimum standard of AMEB Grade 3 or equivalent in Year 6 or 7 and AMEB Grade 4 or equivalent in Year 8.
- They must display excellence as performers, with a high degree of technical proficiency and musicality on one or more instruments.
- They must be prepared to play an active part in the musical life of the College in curricular and co-curricular endeavours.

Applicant requirements:

- Short-listed applicants will be required to perform on their chosen instrument two pieces of contrasting music of approximately two to four minutes duration (time not to exceed eight minutes overall). Those who play two instruments should prepare at least one piece on each instrument to a maximum of eight minutes.
- Auditions will be held at the College in February 2020.
- Vocalists are welcome to apply for scholarships, but should also be learning an instrument to help with ongoing development of musical literacy. They should audition in both areas.
- Applicants are expected to provide their own accompanists.

Conditions

- It is expected that successful students will participate in and meet all requirements of membership in a range of co-curricular music activities, in negotiation with the Director of Performance
- It is expected that successful students will continue individual tuition on their chosen instrument throughout their scholarship and study Music to senior level in the College curriculum.

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
